

WHEREAS, many municipalities in New York State face significant fiscal challenges that are amplified by a slow economic recovery and a state imposed restriction on local revenues; and

WHEREAS, in most instances the county fiscal challenges are directly tied to state imposed mandates and reduced state reimbursement; and

WHEREAS, counties play a central role in delivering state services, due to our state mandated role in the administration and financing of a wide variety of state programs; and

WHEREAS, in 2013, the state enacted Medicaid reforms to assume all of the growth in spending from the local taxpayers by 2015; and

WHEREAS, local taxpayers continue to fund \$7.5 billion of Medicaid costs; now be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Gaines strongly encourages the Governor and State Legislature to work to address the underlying causes of fiscal stress facing so many localities; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Gaines believes the State must work diligently to enact a no new unfunded mandates law and constitutional protections against future unfunded mandates; and be it

Supervisor Culhane stated that she had provided the board with 3 tax exemption resolution for their review and consideration at a later date.

Orleans County District Attorney, Joseph Cardone, addressed the Town Board regarding court consolidation. He asked the board to consider holding a public hearing in July to present to the public the idea of consolidating the Gaines Town Court with the Town of Albion Court and possibly the Town of Kendall Court. The Town of Albion has already agreed to the public hearing. He explained that this court consolidation has worked on the west side of Orleans County and he feels it would be beneficial to the central part of the county as well. Each town would still elect a judge from their town, however the judges would have jurisdiction over all towns that participate in the consolidation. Court could be held in each town or in just one court house depending on how the Town Boards decide to proceed. He explained that he didn't feel there would be much cost savings to the town but it would offer better coverage in a judges absence.

Judge Schmidt was present and spoke in favor of the consolidated court proposal.

Legislature Lynne Johnson brought up the fact that this would be a shared service and that it would support the new requirements regarding the 2% tax cap and the residents of Gaines being able to receive their tax rebate checks.
